Promoting Reading at SSP!

Each week we share useful information for parents / carers to promote home reading and reading for pleasure.

Reading Fluency

For those children on our decodable book scheme, we expect them to read the same book on several occasions to develop their reading fluency and proficiency. Reading the same book repeatedly can feel strange (and boring!) at times but here are a few ideas to keep reading fresh and motivating:

- Read one make predictions about the text, adult and child reads the book together, what familiar words does the child recognise? What phonics clues can we use to decode?
- Read two child reads book, uses phonic knowledge to decode
- Read three child reads book but parent models speech / intonation to the child. How are characters speaking their lines?







- What expression do we need in our voice?
- Read four child reads book and adult asks comprehension questions
