Named by one of our pupils, the Nook is our gazebo in our outdoor classroom and is a space where we run some of our ELSA and pastoral support sessions from. This week we have started a lunchtime club which is being offered to all pupils. Staff can recommend children to attend or children can self-refer if they have any worries or concerns. The club is run by an ELSA and two Year 5/6 prefects.

Children who attend will be invited to take part in mindfulness colouring, anxiety coping strategies or activities and games to help support them, depending on their need. The club has already proven to be hugely successful and children are really benefitting from having someone they can talk to each lunchtime.
