Attendance

Our whole school attendance figure since the beginning of the academic year is 94.7%. This is slightly below our school's expectation but is above national averages. Letters have been sent home to any child whose attendance falls below the expected standard for this term. Here is the attendance breakdown of each class:

Safeguarding

Each week we share useful safeguarding information for parents / carers. The purpose is to empower you, raise awareness to protective measures you could adopt and provide up-to-date information on trends in order to safeguard your child.



Contextual Safeguarding

I have recently delivered a staff update training on 'Contextual Safeguarding' and I thought it would be useful to share some of this information with parents and carers too.

Contextual safeguarding seeks to identify and respond to harm and abuse posed to young people outside their home, either from adults or other young people. As children move from early childhood and into adolescence they spend increasing amounts of time socialising independently of their families. The nature of young people's relationships that they form in these settings inform the extent to which they encounter protection or abuse. Research tells us that peer relationships are increasingly influential during adolescence.

There are a wide range of potential risks where the prime cause of harm is outside of the family. This may include: peer on peer abuse; exploitation and online abuse; missing episodes; gang involvement; radicalisation; trafficking and modern slavery.
