# Leave of Absence

Reducing absence from school is a key priority at both national and local level. Missing school reduces a pupil's educational attainment and life chances. This term we have seen an increase in requests for leave of absence. Absences may only be authorised at the discretion of the Headteacher in EXCEPTIONAL circumstances. These include:

• Exceptional family circumstances such as a bereavement/religious observance/wedding of a close family member/family emergency.

- Unavoidable medical/dental appointment
- Absence, within reason, for an external exam such as ballet and music and to attend elite events
- Other exceptional circumstances (discuss these with the headteacher)

Please note that family holidays will not count as a reason to authorise absence in term time, with the exception of the children of armed forces personnel on leave from active service.
